



Simple rules that help our children stay safe

CHILDREN up to 10 years old should hold an adult's hand on the footpath, in the car park and when crossing the road.

Children between five and 10 should be closely supervised in the traffic environment and hold an adult's hand when crossing or preparing to cross the road.

If the adult's hand is occupied, the child should hold the adult's arm, sleeve, bag, a pram or a trolley.

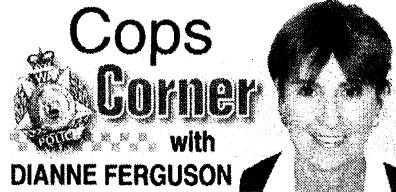
On the footpath, the adult should be closest to the road and the child furthest from traffic.

If the child has a ball it should be in a string or plastic bag.

Parents or carers and children waiting at or walking to a bus stop should be well away from the road.

Pedestrians about to cross the road should be standing one step back from the kerb.

Pedestrians should not cross from between parked cars, near a bus, near a crest or curve in the



road or in any other unsafe situation.

School Speed Restrictions: Speeds in and around schools are now 40kph on school days.

The times are between 7.30-9am and 2.30-4pm.

All roads near schools in Narrogin have been clearly sign-posted at 40kph.

Narrogin Primary School has a traffic warden to control the crossing of school children to the school in the morning and the afternoons.

So the message is clear, when driving near schools, please slow down to 40kph.
